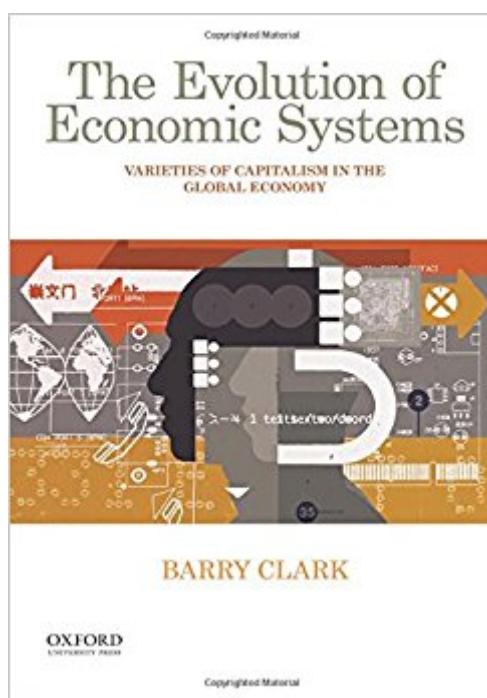


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The Evolution Of Economic Systems: Varieties Of Capitalism In The Global Economy

He has written a text on Political Economy for Praeger and has published numerous articles on political economy. Clark's career focus, however, has been on teaching and making difficult ideas accessible to a broader group of students.

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
