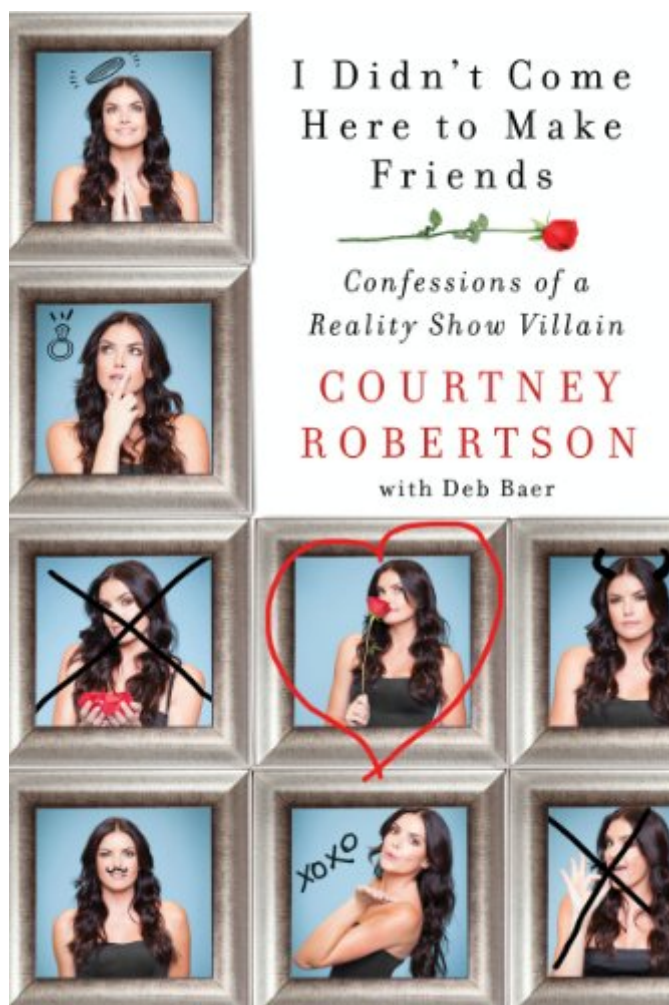


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I Didn't Come Here To Make Friends: Confessions Of A Reality Show Villain
