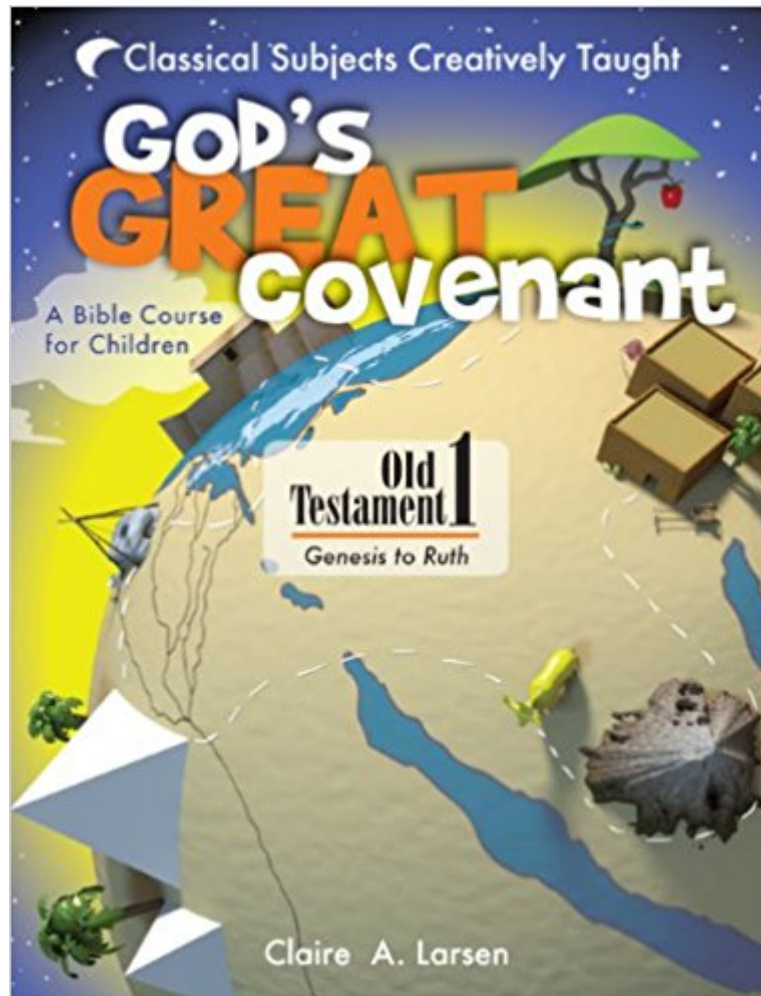

I am using this for part of my first grade daughter's home school curriculum. I purchased this and the teacher's guide based on reviews from . I love that it goes in order starting with Genesis 1:1. My favorite thing though is that it talks about Jesus in the old testament and how it relates to Him coming on earth in human form. One example is the garden of eden story with the first sin. The things that resembled Jesus dying on the cross. Adam working the ground with thistles and thorns and Jesus being made to wear the crown of thorns. I never knew all the meaning of Jesus in the old testament until I was an adult and really am learning a lot as well. Even if we were not homeschooling, I would be happy to do this with my daughter and my son when he is older. She l'd absorbing a lot of the information, although I started out doing most of the writing for her. We are working on passing it on more to her as we have gotten more into school (and less cursive now).

I bought this book for my 6 and 8 year old as a tool for learning GODS word. I am always amazed at what young minds can absorb. It lays things out in a format that can be understood by both parents and children. It is packed with the vital information necessary to both teach and learn the word of GOD. I find that it not only tailors to my 6-8 year olds, but also is very informative and helpful to adults as well. You can not go wrong with this one.

The worksheets are engaging and fun. 5th and 6th graders can do them independently. Younger children will need some help. My students have really enjoyed working through this book. It is well written and very informative. I don't think there is a better curriculum available for elementary school age students.

We are using this as our homeschool Bible program this year but it could also easily be used for a family devotion time too. The OT-1 has 32 chapters (from Creation to Job and then a review). Each lesson has a Theme and a Key Event. Example- Theme: "God redeems His people from slavery" Key Event: "God leads Israel out of Egypt." I also like the Teacher's Manual which has "Notes to Parents" with discussion ideas and the relevant Westminster Catechism questions. You don't

absolutely need the Teacher Manual, but I do like having it. The TM also gives the answers to the worksheets and quizzes. I downloaded the MP3 of the stories being read by Chris Perrin of Classical Academic Press from their website. It is nice for the kids to hear someone else's voice for a change - esp. a man's! I let them color or use modeling clay while they listen and to keep Bible from being a "dreaded" subject, we do the worksheet questions and chapter quizzes orally. They fight over who gets to answer the questions this way! We do one chapter per week (which is 4 days for us). This gives enough review and discussion so they don't forget. We also practice the memory verse each day. As another reviewer said, this program also highlights Jesus in the OT as well which is nice and unique. For example, a gray box in Chapter 15 says "Jesus in the OT: In the wilderness, the Lord provided manna from heaven and water from the rock for Israel. In a like way, Jesus is the Bread of Life and the Living Water: When you trust Jesus, you will never be spiritually hungry or spiritually thirsty." The scripture is taken from the New King James Version and some NIV. Bible has become my kid's favorite subject! Check out see Academic Press' website for beautiful maps and timelines. We also use their Latin for Children A program which is also highly recommended!

I've used several Classical Academic Press products in our homeschool, and have been very pleased with every single one of them. (God's Great Covenant Old Testament 1, New Testament 1, Art of Argument, Song School Latin 1, and Latin for Children 1). But to speak specifically of God's Great Covenant: During a recent month-long Bible trivia challenge I hosted for our church's 4-8th graders, I was astounded by how much my rising fifth grader - who, truth be told, hurried through many of his Bible lessons - had retained of his studies of two God's Great Covenant books. I seriously contemplated to switching this particular child to an in-depth study of Acts along with his older brother, but opted to stick with Classical Academic Press's God's Great Covenant series so he could have the full benefit of its intelligent, thorough, relational, covenantal study of the Scriptural witness. I will be using it again with my younger two children in the coming years and recommend this series to anyone looking for thorough, sound teaching in a beautiful, approachable format.
