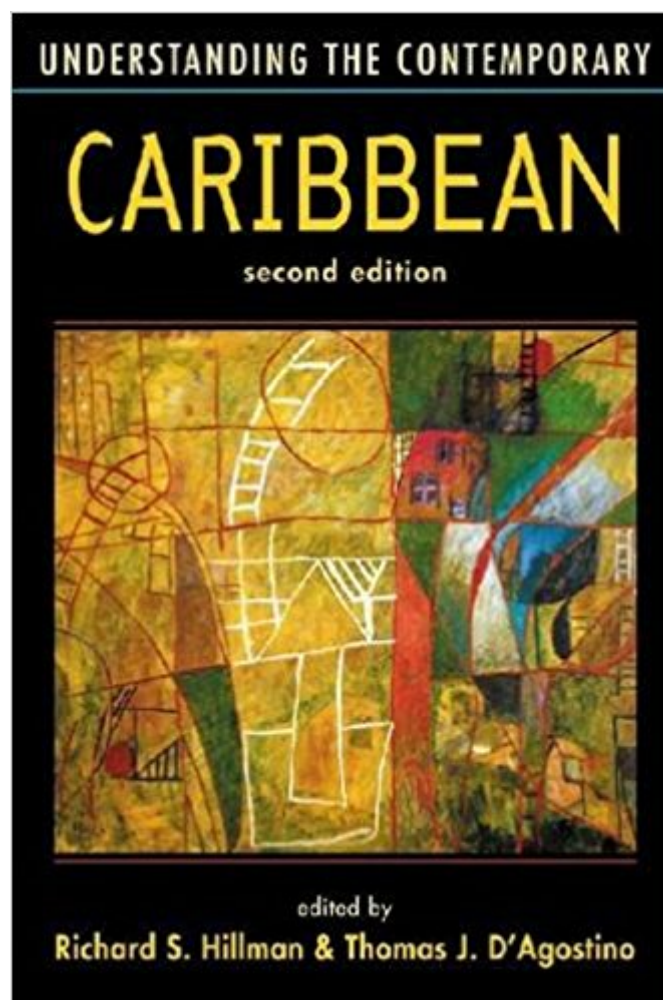




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Understanding The Contemporary Caribbean (Understanding: Introductions To The States And Regions Of The Contemporary World)
