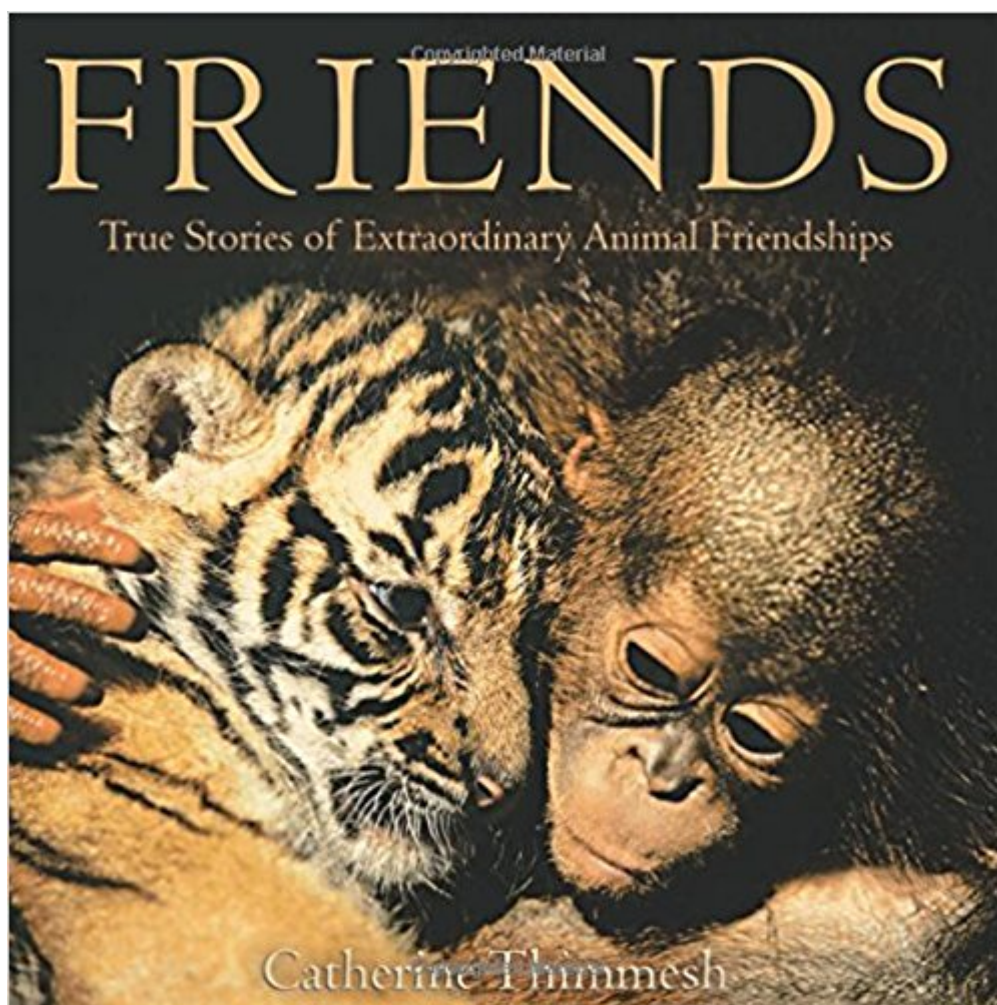

Be sure to read the reviews before purchasing, I found the "poetic" parts of this book are suitable for young children only. I found the low-level quality of the poetry detracted from the effect of the pictures and stories of connection. I love the somewhat older book that is primarily photographs: *Unlikely Friendships: 47 Remarkable Stories from the Animal Kingdom*. I've purchased countless numbers of this book and find it a treasure.

I ordered the book as a gift after seeing an interview with the author on the news. I like the photos and general content of the book and I recommend it to others. My only complaint (why 4 stars instead of 5) is that the book is only about 32 pages long... a fact I missed when I first ordered it. I had hoped for more material. Maybe there will be a another edition, with additional photos and descriptions.

The pictures in this book are very cute. In my opinion, the text was not edited well. Books for kids should have more direct sentences (not so many - and ;) and should NEVER start with "So" or "But". This is page 2 and it drove my 7-year-old crazy: No matter if one walks of four legs or two- a friend provides comfort when one's feeling blue. When the old orangutan at Zoo World in Florida lost her mate, she was listless and would barely eat. Workers worried that she might very well lose her will to live. So they brought a new companion - a stray tabby cat - to her enclosure; first just outside the fence, then in. The two became instant and inseparable friends. For nearly four years, Tonda the orangutan and TK the cat lived side by side - eating, playing, sleeping - until Tonda died of old age. But for four years, both were comforted and content. In this book, all but two of these "friendships" happened in a controlled environment like a zoo or animal hospital, and the text, as

above, describes when the caregivers had to separate the two for their own safety. There's nothing wrong with that, but a book full of mostly these kinds of friendships was a little disappointing. The two friendships that were not in a controlled environment (the basset hound and owl, and the frog letting the mouse hitch a ride to safety) were my kids favorites because they were truly unique. I have a picture of my childhood dog curled up with a raccoon. My kids love to look at that picture and I tell them the story of Rocky, the baby raccoon I found curled up in a feed can one morning when I went out to feed the horses. His eye was badly infected, so my Dad and I drove to the local CO-OP and bought some formula, a bottle, and some antibiotics for Rocky and within a few days he looked healthy and strong. We left his cage open that night figuring he would want to go find his family. Much to our surprise, he chose to spend his summer tagging along with us like one of the dogs but as curious and mischievous as one of the cats. As fall came, Rocky started to wander off more and more at night and eventually he stopped coming home in the morning. Every spring and summer for years after we would see Rocky stealing cat food and an occasional egg, but he had grown wild and didn't want to cuddle up with the dog or be pet anymore. It was fun while it lasted. I have always enjoyed animals and the way they find companions in sometimes unlikely ways, but this collection was just okay.

A truly amazing, wonderful book filled with TRUE stories for all ages to enjoy. Simply beautiful photos.

While it is great for children who are drawn to the warmth of the subject matter, this book also evokes a touching connection in adults to the beauty that lies beneath the surface of animals. It is more than just "Aawh. Isn't that cute" if one looks beneath the surface to see the thread that runs among animals..

This was purchased for my 90 year old aunt as well as my friend's grandchildren and both age group loved the book!! I enjoyed reading it and seeing the absolutely gorgeous photography. A real Winner.

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
