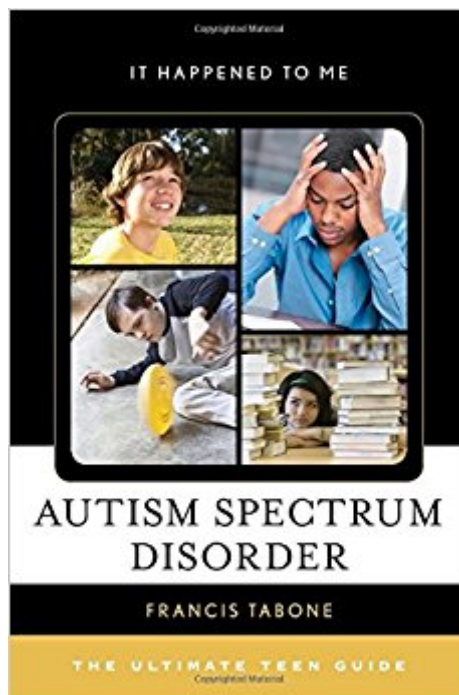




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# Autism Spectrum Disorder: The Ultimate Teen Guide (It Happened To Me)
