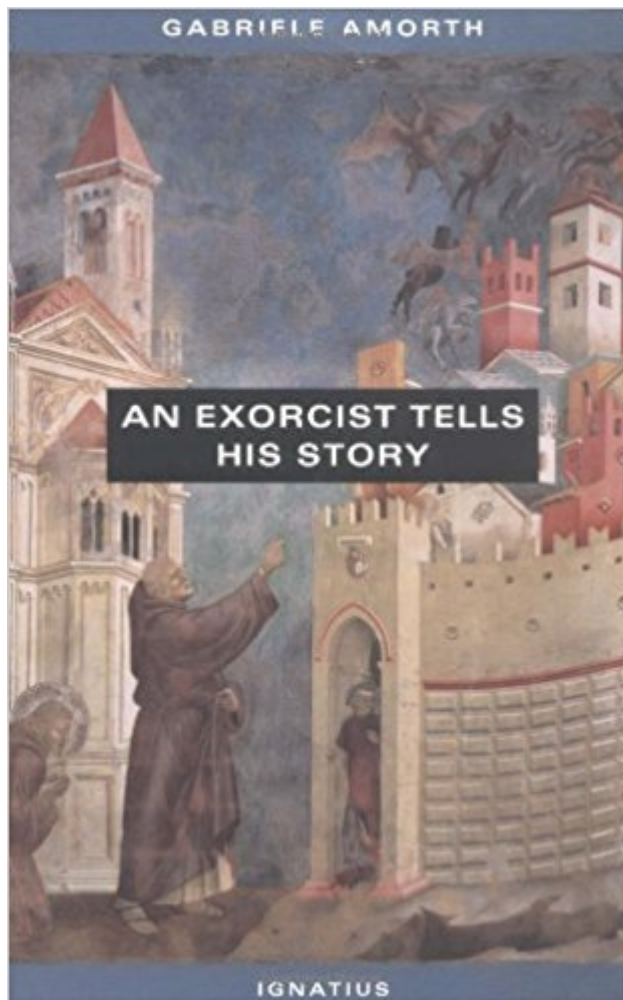

My only confusion (the presence of Satan?) about Father Amorth's discussion on the requirements of exorcism, is that he always insists on a sensitive being present to pick up on paranormal activity. But he characterizes all people with medium ability as receiving this "talent" from Satan. This confusion or lack of explanation may be a glitch in the translation from Italian, the language I assume Fr. Amorth

gave his interviews in, to English. So I am still left to wonder what the role of intuitive ability is in the fight between good and evil. I've always cultivated and used mine to protect myself. And to seek the truth.
